Itinerary

Spend a day painting in beautiful Joshua Tree. Few destinations offer a landscape as unique as Joshua Tree National Park. In this one-day outdoor class, you will focus on observation, setting an intention for the day, and learning the process of acrylic landscape painting. Janis Commentz is known for her color-intense palette and loose brush strokes. The morning will begin with basic introduction to materials and the painting process. Topics include laying out your palette, color mixing, translating your observations into a painted image, tips for lights and darks, and planning a successful composition. Both group and individual instruction will help you develop your painting and explore new techniques.

The desert is a fragile environment and eco painting techniques will be used. Please note that the class will follow Leave No Trace

What to Bring to the Course

Required Class Materials

Essential List:

Small Sketchbook 5"x7" or 8" x 10"

Graphite Pencils - soft drawing pencils (4B, 6B) or inexpensive mechanical pencils

Eraser - white or kneaded

Pastel pencils - green, brown, gray, blue or red-orange (1-2)

Brushes – Brite or Flat sizes #4, #6, #8 and larger brushes you like

Acrylic medium (recommended Golden Fluid Matte Medium or Liquitex Matte Medium)

Water container filled with water with lid – (a plastic juice jar 52-59 oz. works well)

Open water container- large mouth plastic jar-such as a large yogurt or other plastic container

Paper towels

Palette – *small* (8 ½ x 7") or *large* (12" x 16") recommended Masterson's Sta-wet Palette + Sta-Wet acrylic palette paper+cellulose sponge-prepared/bathed in hot water day before

1-2 painting surfaces: canvas, clayboard or gessoed Masonite panels – 8" x 10" and/or 11" x 14"

Drawing board with clips, plein air easel, or pochade box with tripod

Bag or backpack to carry supplies

Recommended acrylic paint (good quality acrylic - I recommend Golden or Liquitex Heavy Body, but any student-grade acrylic paints are acceptable)

1. Magenta
2. Cadmium Yellow
3. Cadmium Orange
4. Cadmium Red Light
5. Ultramarine Blue
6. Cobalt Blue
7. Phthalo Blue
8. Yellow Ochre
9. Titanium White

Optional Class Materials

Paint:

1. Cerulean Blue
1. Unbleached Titanium
2. Phthalo Green
3. Colors you like

The 10 Essentials: Everyday in the Desert

- Day pack
- 4 quarts of water
- Hiking boots with traction soles
- Lunch and snacks
- Clothing layers
- Hat
- Sun glasses
- Sunscreen
- Notebook and pencil/pen
- Whistle

Fitness Requirements

Participants must be in good physical condition for courses/activities in a desert that may be hot, dry, windy, and sometimes surprisingly cold.

Hike Level

Easy

Guidelines

- You are responsible for your safety.
- Park your car in designated areas only. Parking along the side of the road is dangerous to you and the environment.
- Rattlesnakes are present in the desert. Avoid contact with wildlife. Put your hands and feet only where you can see them.
- Stay with the group. If you get lost, stay put.
- Drink plenty of water. If you run out, notify the instructor or the Desert Institute Representative.
- Before leaving the class, check out with Desert Institute Representative.

Instructor Biography

Janis Commentz is a painter living in the Mojave Desert. She has taught high school art, classes at the 29 Palms Art Gallery, summer art camp, life drawing and Desert Institute painting workshops. She has a B.A. in art and British Literature from the University of Redlands and an M.A. in Education from California State University at San Bernardino.

She exhibits in Southern California and has participated in the Hwy 62 Open Studio Art Tours, Joshua Tree National Park Juried Art Exposition, Joshua Tree National Park Spring Art Festival, Art Faire at California State University at San Bernardo and Art For Heaven's

Sake, Redlands. Commentz has served as Gallery Director for Gallery 62 in Joshua Tree. She has been the featured artist at Gallery 62, Glass Outhouse Art Gallery in Twentynine Palms and the 29 Palms Art Gallery.

Color and light are an important part of her impressionistic landscapes. Although Commentz grew up near the coast, she believes desert beauty is an acquired taste and enjoys plein air painting in the Southwest.
